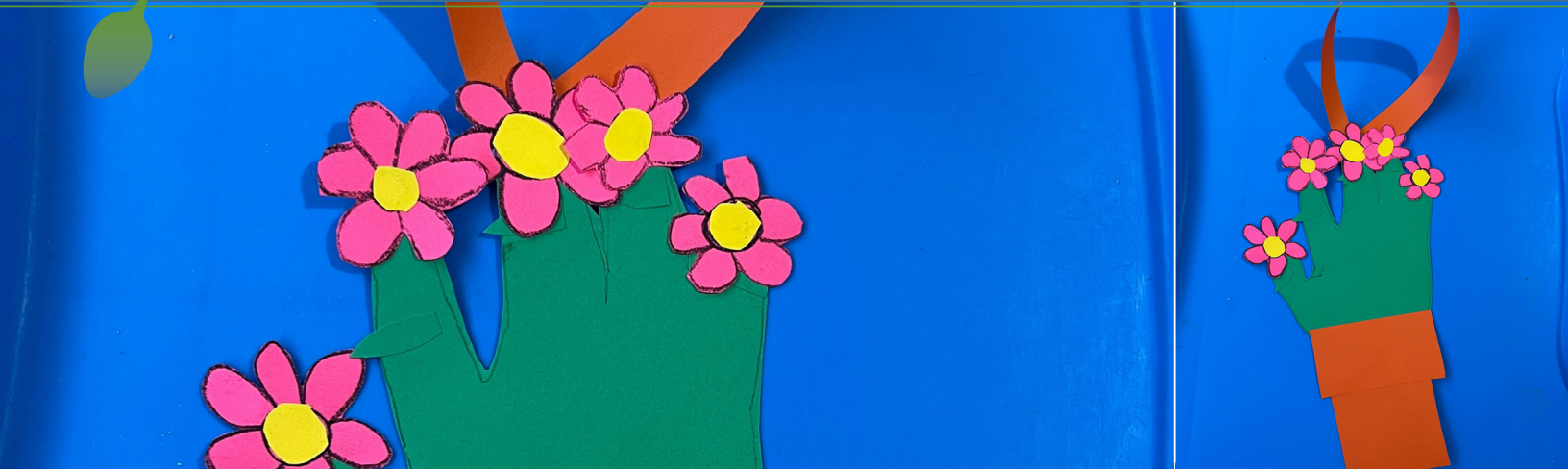


## HAND FLOWERPOT



### Materials

Any Color  
Construction Paper  
Scissors  
Glue Stick  
Pencil

### Directions

1. Trace over hands with a pencil and cut around the hand with scissors.
2. Draw flowers on the construction paper and cut around the flowers.
3. Draw a flowerpot and cut around the pot.
4. Cut circles for the inside of the flower and glue them together.
5. Glue the flower to the fingers
6. Cut a straight line down the final pieces of paper and fold it so the end pieces are touching and glue it on the back.

### Hints and Extended Learning Opportunities

- Read as a group, *The Tiny Seed* by Eric Carle.
- Fill a sensory table or tub with water and flower petals.
- Go on a walk and complete our *Spring Scavenger Hunt* (attached).
- Have children grow their own bean sprout in a mason jar or a baggie placed on the window.
- For younger children, promote fine motor skills by having them use a cotton swab dipped in glue to attach pre-made flowers to the handprint.
- For older children, challenge them to create flowers with a different number of petals on each finger. Practice counting the number of petals on each flower.
