

POTATO BLUEBERRY STAMPS



Materials

Fingerling or Red Potato
(to use as a stamper)

White Paper (or basket
template linked below)

Blue Tempera Paint

Paper Plate

Popsicle Sticks (9 per child)

Glue

Directions

1. Prior to starting, trim off the end of each potato to create a potato stamp to dip into paint.
2. Pour blue paint onto paper plate.
3. Give each child a piece of white paper. Dip potato stamp into blue paint and push onto paper gently to create blueberries.
4. Once the paint has dried, have children glue popsicle sticks onto the paper to create a basket shape.
